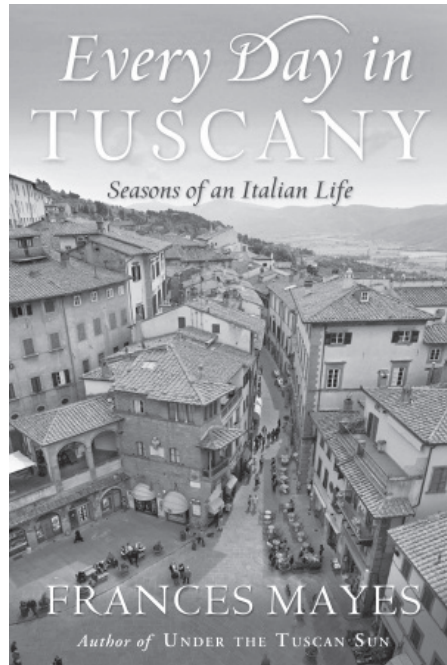
Book Review: “Every Day in Tuscany”

by Frances Mayes

- *Every Day in Tuscany: Seasons of an Italian Life* by Frances Mayes
- Hardcover: 320 pages
- Publisher: Broadway (March 9, 2010)

Frances Mayes offers her readers a deeply personal memoir of her present-day life in Tuscany, encompassing both the changes she has experienced since her earlier memoirs appeared, and sensuous, evocative reflections on the timeless beauty and vivid pleasures of Italian life. Among the themes Mayes explores are how her experience of Tuscany dramatically expanded when she renovated and became a part-time resident of a 13th century house with a stone roof in the mountains above Cortona, how life in the mountains introduced her to a “wilder” side of Tuscany—and with it a lively engagement with Tuscany’s mountain people. Throughout, she reveals the concrete joys of life in her adopted hill town, with particular attention to life in the piazza, the art of Luca Signorelli (Renaissance painter from Cortona), and the pastoral pleasures of feasting from her garden. Moving always toward a deeper engagement, Mayes writes of Tuscan icons that have become for her storehouses of memory, of crucible moments from which bigger ideas emerged, and of the writing life she has enjoyed in the room where *Under the Tuscan Sun* began.

She is Too Fond of Books’ review: Have you ever ordered a meal in a restaurant, say a Western omelet, and when it’s served you think, this isn’t what I expected. The ham and peppers are all



mixed in with the eggs, instead of folded in the middle with the cheese. But, you eat it anyway, and, hey, it’s good! Really good. Yummy, warm, melted cheese; salty ham; crisp peppers. Well, if Western omelets aren’t your thing, substitute any other of your favorite comfort foods, forgive the mangled metaphor, and understand that this was my experience with *Every Day in Tuscany*.

It has been several years since I read *Under the Tuscan Sun* (and I haven’t read Mayes’ second memoir, *Bella Tuscany*), but I remember that book as having a clear beginning, conflict, and resolution (the filling separated from the eggs, if you will). In *Every Day in Tuscany*, Mayes’ gorgeous prose take the reader through the seven or so months she spends each year in Italy; each

chapter focuses on one particular theme of her “Italian Life” – her husband’s birthday celebration, time spent with her grandson, wandering the countryside for hours, visits to the sea and vineyards, local lore, and historic arts. They are more of beautifully crafted observations than a story; in her heart, she always returns home, to Bramasole:

If I were a medieval woman weaving a family tapestry, the knowledge gleaned from living here would form my borders and backgrounds. Instead of a procession of men with falcons on decorated horses, or a lady mincing along on a unicorn, there would be the iconic long table, the gathered friends, the servers and diners, all loved faces and richly colored threads for the rose, the lemon, the twining bean, sunflower, moonflower vine, and all the creatures who also are as at home as we are where we live. Above the scene, I’d stitch the golden disk of the sun and jagged rays. Bramasole, from *bramare*, to yearn for, and *sole*, sun, means something that yearns for the sun.

Central to each chapter are friendships with both locals and other ex-pats who have made their way either to Cortona (the home of Bramasole, Mayes primary Italian residence, which she lovingly restored in *Under the Tuscan Sun*) or to the mountain community where she and Ed have restored a stone cottage. And where there are friends, there is food! Each chapter discusses food – shopping at the local markets, foraging in the area around her home for nature’s bounty, preparing meals (not to be

hurried, Mayes enjoys making the meals as much as eating them), and dining. From snacking on the terrace with Ed, to feasts for 25 or more, Mayes writes as if cooking were effortless and sensuous pleasures.

One of her passages about food and dining contrasts the Italian way with the typical American way:

At the call "A tavola!" to the table, you flush with pleasure; you are coming into a celebratory ambiance. Something wonderful is about to happen. Food is natural, eaten with gusto. It must affect your digestion if you think the first quality of pasta is that it's fattening. If the word "sin" is attached to dessert. I've never heard of a dish referred to as "your protein" or "a carb," and there's no

dreary talk at all about glutens, portion control, fat content or calories. Eating in Italy made me aware of how tortured the relationship to food is in my country. After a long Tuscan dinner, I feel not only the gift of exceptional company, food, and wine, but also an inexplicable sense of well-being, of revival. Dinner invigorates the spirit as it nourishes the body.

In order to share some of Tuscany's gastronomic delights with her readers, Mayes has included dozens of recipes (and there's not a Western omelet in sight!). Here's a sampling:

- Ravioli Ripieni di Patate con Zucchine e Speck al Pecorino (Potato Ravioli with Zucchini, Speck, and Pecorino)
- Pollo al Mattone (Chicken Under a

Brick)

- Caldarroste (Roasted Chestnuts)
- Respelle al Procini e Ricotta (Porcini and Ricotta Crepes)
- Torta di Suisine con Mandorle (Plum Tart)

Every Day in Tuscany: Seasons of an Italian Life is an intimate insider's view of a fairly carefree way to spend the majority of each year. Frances Mayes and her family do experience some conflicts (some with nature, some with locals), but for the most part it seems relaxing and enjoyable. She doesn't flaunt the fame her earlier work has brought her, but welcomes the reader to share a bit of her 'everyday' experiences. If you enjoy travel, history, or food, Every Day in Tuscany will be a vicarious pleasure.

May Festivals in Italy

Italian Celebrations, Holidays, and Events in May, by Martha Bakerjian, About.com Guide

May in Italy is a good time to find spring festivals. You'll find flower festivals, food and wine festivals, medieval reenactments, and events celebrating rituals of spring. Although you'll probably come across other local festivals, here are some of the highlights.

May Day, May 1, is a public holiday all over Italy as the day of the worker. Many services will be closed but you may find interesting parades and festivals to celebrate the day. Expect big crowds in popular Italian tourist destinations.

John Paul II Beatification Ceremony is May 1, 2011, and hundreds of thousands of pilgrims are expected to flock to Rome and Vatican City so expect huge crowds if you're going to Rome.

The Sagra di Sant Efsio on May 1 is one of the most important festivals in Sardinia. A colorful 4-day procession leads from Cagliari to the Romanesque church of Saint Efsio on the beach at Nora. Decorated oxcarts and horsemen accompany the saint's statue in a parade followed by food and dancing.

Ring Race and Procession, reenactments of 14th century contests and parades, continues in Narni in the

Umbria region through May 12 (starts near the end of April).

Calendimaggio is celebrated in early May in Assisi, Umbria. The festival is recommended by Manuela of Italian Ceramics who says - It is a spectacular evocation of Medieval and Renaissance costumes and life. The two ancient medieval wards, the "Parte di Sopra" and the "Parte di Sotto", engage in a spectacular challenge which takes the

form of theatre shows, concerts, songs and choruses, dances, processions, archery, crossbow and flag-waving displays. The districts compete in a singing contest among the spectacular floral decorations, flags, torches and candles. 2009 dates are May 7-9.


The Risotto Festival the first Sunday in May in the Piedmont town of Sessame is a huge feast of a special rice dish dating back to the 13th century.

The Snake Handlers' Procession is the first Thursday in May in Cocullo in the Abruzzo region. A statue of St. Dominic, the town's patron saint, is carried through town covered with live serpents.

The Wedding of the Trees, Spozalizio dell'Albero, takes place May 8 in the northern Lazio town of Vetralla. A couple of oak trees are decorated with garlands, horsemen offer bouquets of the first spring flowers and new trees are planted while everyone enjoys a free picnic lunch. The ceremony revives Vetralla's sovereignty over the forests and continues the right of each citizen to a cubic meter of firewood annually.

Giro d'Italia, Italy's big bike race similar to the Tour d'France, starts in early May

and lasts most of the month. The race takes in scenic countryside and it's fine to watch a leg or two.

La Palombella, in Orvieto, is a festival representing the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. The festival is held on Pentecost Sunday in the piazza in front of the duomo and ends with a fireworks display. The 2010 date is May 23.

The Fish festival of Saint Fortunato, patron saint of fishermen, is celebrated in the beautiful fishing village of Camogli, south of Genoa, the second Sunday in May. Saturday night there is a huge fireworks display and bonfire competition followed by free fried fish on Sunday.

Polenta Festival, also the second Sunday in May, is celebrated in the main square of the Piedmont town of Avigliana.

La Barabbata is celebrated May 14 in Marta on the shores of Lake Bolsena. In this procession, men wear costumes representing the old trades and carry their tools while white buffalo pull floats carrying the fruits of the trades.

The Festa dei Ceri, a candle race and costumed parade in Gubbio takes place May 15 and is followed by a Historical Cross-Bow Exhibition on the last Sunday of May. St. Rita's Procession and Candle Festival is May 21-22 in Cascia in Umbria.

Infiolata di Noto, a huge festival with flower petal art displays and a parade, takes place in Noto, Sicily, the third weekend of May.

The Flower Festival of Bucchianico in the Abruzzo includes a re-enactment of a 13th-century military stratagem with a parade, the third Sunday in May.

Pinocchio's Birthday is celebrated May 25 in the Tuscan town of Pescia.

Il Palio di Ferrara, a historical horse race dating from 1279, is run the last Sunday in May. There are parades, events, or competitions every weekend in May including a historical procession to the castle with over 1000 people in Renaissance costumes on the Saturday night of the weekend before the race.

Cantine Aperte, open cantinas, is a big wine celebration throughout Italy the last weekend of May. Many cantine or wineries are open to guests and have special events.

Roman Fest is a 3-day re-enactment of a typical ancient Roman festival in the Piedmont town of Alesandria, the last weekend of May. The festival includes parades, feasts, staged gladiator combat and chariot races.

The Chianti Wine Festival, the last Sunday in May and first Sunday in June, takes place in Montespertoli in the Chianti wine region of Tuscany.

Medieval Parade and Jousting Tournament in the Emilia Romagna region town of Grazzano Visconti is the last Sunday in May.

The Daffodil Festival in the Abruzzo town of Rocca di Mezzo celebrates spring with folk dancing and a parade the last Sunday in May.
